New Features coming in WebGIS

We are working on a new release of WebGIS which will enhance the functionality and provide users new tools. The release will consist of the following new features, zoom preview and zoom to scale, a user configurable tool tips and enhanced metadata.

Tele-works Partnership

Anderson & Associates and Tele-works have formed a business partnership that will utilize a specialty of each firm. A&A plans to write a GIS plug-in to ESRI to accompany Tele-Works software. The GIS module is expected to be an add-on component that Tele-works can use in conjunction with their database. The tool would enable the user to select people for notification using physical shapes that could be drawn on a digital map. For instance a 3 mile buffer could be drawn around a spill site and all of the people whose physical locations fall within that 3 mile buffer would automatically pop up in a database list for immediate notification. This system would allow users to visualize the location of people in relation to an event such as flooding or high winds. For more information on the partnership please contact Susan Moore.
